ABOUT WINDWALKERS: Celebrating its 20th Anniversary in 2025, Windwalkers weekly serves more than 135 clients and numerous specialized groups from our three counties with a herd of 24 equine therapy horses. These groups include at-risk teens, students with Significant Identifiable Emotional Disabilities (SIED), development delays, autism, TBI and PTSD. With a small staff, an 8-person volunteer Board of Directors, 130+ highly skilled volunteers and an annual budget just over \$1.1 million WindWalker's impact is far reaching.

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
